GARY SINISE FOUNDATION AND AMERICAN AIRLINES HOST SEND-OFF CELEBRATION FOR FAMILIES OF FALLEN MILITARY HEROES ATTENDING SNOWBALL EXPRESS AT SALT LAKE CITY INTERNATIONAL

The Gary Sinise Foundation is hosting more than 1,900 family members of fallen military heroes at Walt Disney World Resort for annual Snowball Express event right before holidays

American Airlines – the presenting sponsor of Snowball Express – is providing numerous charter aircraft and space on commercial flights throughout its global network.

This Saturday 12/3, the Gary Sinise Foundation, and presenting sponsor American Airlines, will bring more than 1,900 family members of our nation's fallen heroes - those whose loved ones have lost their lives serving in the United States military – to Orlando for a special trip to Walt Disney World (WDW) Resort. This special event through the Gary Sinise Foundation's Snowball Express program is back for the first time after a two-year pause due to the COVID-19 pandemic and is bigger than ever with the most families ever flown with the program this year.

Families will travel on 11 donated American Airlines charter aircraft staffed with all-volunteer crews. The charters will make stops in 22 cities across the country with hundreds of additional participants traveling from around the world, including Guam, Japan and West Africa.

The Gary Sinise Foundation supports thousands of families of our fallen military heroes year-round through their Snowball Express program with empowerment workshops and regional community events, as well as their annual five-day experience at WDW from December 3-7, where family members spend time together, honoring their fallen loved one while cultivating relationships and making special memories together in a warm and welcoming environment.

Media are invited to attend the send-off party Concourse B for children and families aboard the SLC Airport *Snowball Express*.

WHAT: Gary Sinise Foundation Snowball Express, along with presenting sponsor and official airline partner American Airlines, will fly more than 1,900 family members of fallen U.S. military heroes to Disney World in Orlando, FL Dec. 3-7.

Before departing SLC, families will enjoy special events and a send-off ceremony at Gate B-13.

WHERE: Salt Lake City International Airport Terminal
Meet at the American Airlines Ticket Counter on Level 3, east side of the Terminal

WHEN: Saturday, Dec. 3, 2022
Meet at 7:30 a.m. to pick up a gate pass. You will need to bring a driver's license and will be going through security screening. So do not bring any prohibited items.

WHO: Children and spouses of service members who have died while on active military service
American Airlines team member volunteers including pilots, flight attendants, airport operations teams and more
