It's a Wrap: SLC Department of Airports Finalizes Master Plan

Plan Provides Road Map to Airport's Future for Next Two Decades

Salt Lake City, UT—Salt Lake City has secured its position as a global aviation hub by opening a brand-new airport that will serve the region for decades to come. To prepare for the future, the Salt Lake City Department of Airports (SLCDA) is updating its Master Plan to determine future facility requirements that will be needed to serve the area and accommodate future air transportation demand for the next 20 years.

The SLCDA has been working on updating the Master Plan since 2018, and is planning the final public information meeting on Thursday, June 17 at 7 p.m. at the new airport in the Terminal Greeting Room. The purpose of the meeting is to report the findings of the master plan and to outline the vision for the airport's next 20 years.

"Our new airport was envisioned more than 20 years ago in the airport's previous Master Plan," said Bill Wyatt, executive director, SLCDA. "The updated plan provides a recommended course of action that details how the airport can continue to meet the community's future aviation transportation needs."

The SLCDA opened Phase 1 of The New SLC Redevelopment Program in fall of 2020, and is currently constructing Phase 2 of the program, which is slated to open in 2023-24.

SLCDA contracted with consultant RS&H to prepare the Master Plan study. RS&H is an architectural, engineering and consulting firm that specializes in providing design, planning and environmental services for airport clients throughout the United States.
