

KU42 RUNWAY OVERLAY PROJECT BEGINS ON MARCH 20

SLCDA will mill and overlay runway16/34and a portion of taxiway A at South Valley Regional Airport (KU42) beginning on March 20.

Phase I begins on March 20 and runs through May 20 (60 days) and includes- realigning taxiway B on the south end, removing taxiways A1 and A2, and constructing a new aircraft run-up area, which will be located north of its present location. The runway will have a temporary 300-foot displacement on the south end with a temporary runway length of 5,300 feet.

Phase II involves milling taxiway A from the corporate hangars to taxiway A-5. Phase II will be done concurrently with phase I and will occur between May 6 and May 20.

During construction, phases I and II fixed wing back taxiing on the runway may be required for takeoff.

Phase III (runway milling and resurfacing) begins on May 20 and ends on June 3. The airport will be closed to all fixed wing operations during that time.

Tie-downs will be made available at Salt Lake International (KSLC) and Tooele Valley Airport (KTVY) for tenants who desire access to their aircraft during phase III.

All dates are subject to change. More information will follow as the project nears.

SOUTH VALLEY REGIONAL RUNWAY CLOSURES IN FEBRUARY

Runway 16/34 at South Valley Regional Airport (KU42) will be closed on February 16 and February 17 between 0400L and 0800L. The closures are for survey work on runway 16/34.

AIRPORT BADGING INFORMATION

Whether your badge is due to expire next week, or next year, or if you are just considering getting a badge, now is the time to prepare! In this article we will go over a few basic requirements to make sure the badging process goes smoothly.

To obtain a new badge or to renew or update an existing badge:

- Always schedule an appointment by calling (801) 575-2423
- Bring a signed application*
- Have one form of photo ID (e.g. a driver's license)
- If you are updating or renewing an existing badge, bring your old badge with you

If you have a Hangar badge you must have the lease holder sign your application, if you are the lease holder, SLC Airport Properties Specialist Phil Bevan may sign your application. If you have a corporate hangar badge, an authorized signer with your company must sign your application. If your badge has been lost:

- Report the lost badge immediately by calling (801) 575-2423
- Pay replacement fee of \$50 (no cash or personal checks)
- Sign badge status change form available atwww.slcairport.com/badging/forms-library
- Bring in one form of photo ID

Lost badges can be replaced on a walk-in basis. If the badge has been stolen, the process is the same but no payment is required if a police report is provided.
