REPORT ALL WILDLIFE STRIKES

The FAA maintains a wildlife strike reporting system for pilots to report and document the effects of a wildlife strike. The reporting page can be found at https://faa.gov/strikenew.aspx.

Be prepared with the following information:

- Aircraft make and model
- Aircraft registration
- Date of incident
- Time of incident
- Airport, runway, or general location
- Details of flight
- Detail of damage
- Detail of damage cost

Please notify airport personnel of strikes that occur at any of the three Salt Lake City Department of Airports operated airports. Personnel are on hand at Salt Lake City International Airport and South Valley Regional Airport to respond and take remaining biological samples from the strike area. The samples are tested to verify which species was struck. The information obtained through sampling helps identify which species are creating problems and can help with remedial mitigation efforts.
