SLC AIRPORT PLANNING FOR INCREASED TRAVELERS DURING HOLIDAY SEASON

Salt Lake City, UT—Salt Lake City International Airport (SLC) will be extra busy in the coming days as passengers board flights for holiday travel. But have no fear, SLC has been ranked one of the least stressful airports to fly into during the holiday season.

According to Remedy Review, SLC can claim this status largely because it is a drama-free airport. SLC's record for having fewer delays and flight cancellations contributes to the ranking. Remedy Review also noted SLC's amenities for travelers, such as the airport's art collection and online mile tracker for those tracking their steps.

To help ease the way for passengers, SLC volunteer Airport Ambassadors will be on hand to answer questions and provide directions. Plus, local musicians are scheduled to perform throughout the day on December 24, while Santa Claus will be spreading cheer pre-security and taking last-minute Christmas wishes.

SLC officials suggest the following travel tips to navigate during the busy travel season. Before leaving for the airport, passengers should check the airline's website to ensure the flight is on time and has not been delayed due to weather. In addition, passengers are encouraged to print or download boarding passes prior to leaving for SLC to expedite check-in and save time at the airline ticket counters. Passengers should arrive two hours before their scheduled boarding time—three hours for international flights—in order to allow time to park, check bags and go through the security checkpoint. Plus, the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) encourages the public to follow the 3-1-1 liquids rule. TSA travel tips can be found at www.tsa.gov/travel/travel-tips.

When picking up passengers, SLC asks drivers to check the status of incoming flights via the airline's website www.slairport.com. Drivers who arrive early should remain in the airport's Park and Wait lot until passengers are ready to be picked up at the curb.
