Theresa Foxley called the meeting, held in-person at the SLCDA Admin Offices Board Room and via Webex, to order at 9:01 a.m. (\* indicates the party attended virtually)

### A. Minutes

A motion was made by Theresa Foxley and seconded by Roger Boyer to approve the minutes of August 7, 2024, at 9:29am as presented. All votes were affirmative; motion passed.

### **B.** Director's Report

Bill Wyatt, Executive Director, gave an update to the Airport Advisory Board regarding current events including,

- Blue Tie Gala was a huge success. Thanks to Nancy Volmer for coordinating the event
- Last week we closed on a 300-million-dollar revolver of credit designed to get us through 2025
- The remaining aspects of the project have been formalized into contracts, and the costs for all outstanding tasks are clearly defined
- October 22 the Central Tunnel will open along with the first four gates

Dirk Burton inquired about the smaller airlines having hidden fees. Bill Wyatt explained without the ultra-low-cost carriers changing the core fare there are ancillary fees when you purchase a ticket.

John Bradshaw asked about the progress on the runway extension. Wyatt explained that during periods of increased temperatures, the current runway conditions necessitate asking passengers to remain behind, which impacts operations. The 2,000-foot center runway extension is essential to mitigate this issue.

Bradshaw asked for an update on South Valley and Tooele. Wyatt stated the contractor is out in Tooele now putting in sewer and water lines.

### D. Aviation Industry & Air Service Update – Nathan Lavin, Air Service and business Development Manager, SLCDA

Nathan Lavin, Airport Air Service and Business Development Manager, presented an update on the Aviation Industry & Air Service (presentation on file). Main points included were:

- Growth at SLC Airport
  - Record 27M Passengers in 2023
  - 6% Seat Growth in 2024
- New and Resuming Flights
  - o Delta
    - Indianapolis 2/2024. Columbus & Santa Barbara 5/2023. Fayetteville, AR 2/2025
  - o Avelo
    - Santa Rosa 10/2024
  - o Hawaiian
    - Honolulu 5/2024
  - Aeromexico
    - Mexico City Summer 2024 / Ski Season
- US Industry Trends
  - Fares have Stabilized but are Significantly Higher than five years ago.
  - 2024 has been a Turning Point for the Industry
- 2023 Passenger Traffic Exceeded 2019 Levels
- 2024 Domestic Seat Capacity Back Above 2019 and Growing
  - Scheduled 2024 Domestic Seat Capacity is 4% above 2023 and now 7% above Pre-pandemic Levels
  - Total Domestic Flights are still down 7% Compared to 2019 Levels as average Aircraft size Continues to Grow
- Robust Growth of Average Fares has Slowed Considerably
  - In Q2 2022, fares Increased to Unprecedented Levels, 17% Higher than Q2 2019.
  - U.S. Domestic O&D Passengers by Airline Business Model
    - o Global network carrier share fell from 73% in 2000 to 52% in 2023
    - Southwest gained share through 2015 but has lost share since.
- Jet Fuel Prices Improving but Remain High
  - In Spring 2022, Jet Fuel prices peaked at over \$5 per gallon
  - Average rates in 2024 have fallen 24% from the average 2022 rates
  - Rates are still 34% higher than levels five years ago




## Since the height of the Covid-19 pandemic, airline revenues have seen a modest decrease as a share of total operating revenues









#### **CONSTRUCTION REPORT**

#### **CONSTRUCTION**

- Pump Station #9 Renovations Construction for this project is on hold due to long lead equipment items. Installation of new screens/grates, pump shaft, generator and pad, and new meter vault have been completed. Anticipated completion for this project is March 14, 2025.
- (2) Electrical Vehicle Charging Stations (FY23) The underground conduit installation has been completed along with the ground boring work. Open trenches have been flow-filled and will be paved back in mid-October. Due to long lead equipment items, substantial completion is anticipated for February 28, 2025.
- (3) **Equipment Storage Building -** The Contractor is completing asphalt repairs this week along with minor, fire and electrical work. A final walk through will be scheduled in mid-October, and substantial completion is anticipated by the end of October 2024.
- (4) **Taxiway F Reconstruction (G-F1)** The project is in the final phase of construction which includes connecting a new duct bank, shoulder paving, and final striping that will allow a new connector Taxiway (F1) to open. Substantial completion and the opening of the new taxiway is anticipated in late October 2024.
- (5) **Runway Deicer Fluid Tanks** The concrete foundation and containment walls have been completed. The four (4), 20,000-gallon deicer fluid tanks have been ordered and are expected to arrive in early November 2024. Substantial completion is scheduled for November 30, 2024.
- (6) Demo Row 21 & FAA FMP & Pavement Restoration The Contractor has completed subgrade stabilization and placement of engineered fill at the FMP site. Asphalt paving is scheduled for October 14, 2024, and project completion is anticipated by November 19, 2024. The Overflow Parking lot portion of the project, Change Order No. 3, was completed on October 5, 2024, striping will be completed inhouse by Airport Maintenance, and the lot will be open for use by October 17, 2024.
- (7) **Concourse B Maintenance T.I.** Substantial completion was achieved on July 18, 2024, following the project's punch walk. The SLC Building Services Department has issued the Certificate of Occupancy. The Contractor faced some delays addressing punch list items, but the space is now ready for occupancy, with only minor BAS adjustments remaining.
- (8) **Terminal Front Access Road & GT Lot Improvements -** Phases 1-3 on the B and C lanes are now complete. Phase 4, the traffic signal and crosswalk from the B to the C lanes will be completed by October 31, 2024. Phase 5, the new Media Lot crosswalk is complete, except for the flashing beacon which will be installed in late October. Phase 6, sealcoating and striping of the GT Lot will be completed by October 14, 2024, except for signage which is in production. The project is on target to be substantially complete by November 1, 2024.

- (9) Ground Transportation Restrooms & Charging Stations Infrastructure The excavation for the utility tie-in has been completed and re-paving has occurred. The restroom structure has been erected and roof joists are being installed. Delays to permanent electrical power are anticipated due to contract negotiations with RMP. Substantial completion is anticipated for October 30, 2024.
- (10) National Weather Service Replacement Controls A notice to proceed was issued to the Contractor on July 30, 2024. Submittals are currently being prepared for review and approval by SLCDA.
- (11) **Bus Plaza EV Stations** The bid opening for this project was held on May 9, 2024. The apparent low bidder is Cache Valley Electric. Contract documents have been executed. An administrative notice to proceed was issued on October 7, 2024, to address long lead items for the project. Construction is anticipated to begin in the Spring of 2025.
- (12) AOC Backup Generator Bids for the project were opened on August 15, 2024. All-Tech Electric submitted the low bid for the project in the amount of \$452,995.00. Contract documents have been executed. A pre-construction meeting was held on October 1, 2024. The Contractor is currently preparing submittals for review and approval by SLCDA.
- (13) **TVY Water and Sewer Improvements** Construction continues and is nearing completion on the in-ground utilities. Substantial completion could be pushed further than expected due to delays in the delivery of sewer pump components, which were long lead items that were further impacted by East Coast port issues. All other work will be completed on the project by the end of October 2024.
