LOWEST POVERTY RATE IN U.S.

As part of the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute's 2025 Economic Report and U.S. Census Bureau, the State of Utah has the lowest poverty rate in the nation at 6.7%, well below the U.S. average of 11.4%. This indicates Utah's strong wages, strong job growth, and relatively low cost of living. The report also highlights Utah had the highest GDP Growth of all U.S. states for 2024, at 4.6%.
