

# State of the Industry

Operational challenges and economic headwinds that have tested the aviation industry the last few years seem to be giving way to more stability as airlines make progress on a path to recovery. Network airlines, such as Delta and American are hiring pilots to bring more capacity to underserved markets. By this summer, most U.S. airlines plan to have their networks restored to 2019 capacity, with many forecasting growth.

Following recent operational challenges, airlines are implementing new practices and investing in new technology to enable resiliency during irregular operational periods brought on by events such as poor weather or power/ IT outages.

## **SLC Airport Update**

SLC continues to experience high passenger demand thanks largely to a robust ski season. Early in February, the airport experienced its busiest day on record, when more than 32,000 passengers passed through the security checkpoint. A couple weeks later, this record was again broken on Presidents' Day, when more than 35,000 passengers returned home from ski trips and the NBA All-Star Game.




### Air Service Update

New air service is on the way! In the last couple of months, SLC has welcomed two new carriers to the market—Spirit and Air Canada. Spirit will begin daily flights to Las Vegas, Los Angeles and Orlando this May, while Air Canada will resume thrice weekly flights to Toronto in June, after a five-year absence. The Air Canada flight will connect SLC with the airline's global hub, providing not only nonstop access to Canada's largest city, but robust one-stop access to other Canadian markets, Europe, Middle East, Africa and Asia. Also resuming this spring/summer, is Delta's nonstop flights to Paris and London-Heathrow, which have not operated at SLC since the pandemic began, along with KLM's flight to Amsterdam.
