
Five Fun Facts About Aviation

- 1. The black box is actually orange. Aviation black boxes, which record flight data and cockpit conversations, are painted bright orange to make them easier to find after an accident. They're incredibly durable and designed to withstand extreme conditions.
- 2. The fastest commercial airplane is the Concorde. A supersonic passenger airliner, the Concorde could fly at speeds of up to 1,354 miles per hour (2,180 kilometers per hour), which is over twice the speed of sound. When in operation, the airplane cut the flight time between New York and London to about 3.5 hours!
- 3. The weight of a Boeing 747 engine is roughly the same as an elephant. The engine weighs almost 9,500 pounds.
- 4. The world's busiest airport is Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) in Atlanta, Georgia. In terms of passenger numbers, ATL has consistently ranked as the

- busiest with more than 100 million passengers a year!
- 5. **The Wright Brothers' first flight only lasted 12 seconds.** On December 17, 1903, Orville and Wilbur Wright made their historic first flight in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina. The flight lasted only 12 seconds and covered 120 feet but it was the beginning of the era of powered flight.
