#### **South Valley Overflow Parking**

# South Valley Hangar Waiting List Updated

The first update of the South Valley Regional Airport hangar waiting list since implementation of the \$150 deposit is now available. The demand for single, enclosed hangars has dropped from 270 spots to 107. Demand for all hangar categories has dropped at least 33%.
