First Phase of The New SLC Now Open

At 4:00 a.m. on September 15, the Salt Lake City Department of Airports (SLCDA) turned the key and opened the first phase of The New SLC Airport. As the lights dimmed on the existing airport, the lights brightened on a new parking garage, gateway center, central terminal and Concourse A-west. Delta Air Lines will occupy the 25 gates in Concourse A-west, including six international gates. In six weeks-on Oct. 27-Concourse B-west will open with 20 gates for Alaska, American, Frontier, JetBlue, Southwest and United airlines.

"This day has been years in the making," said Bill Wyatt, SLCDA executive director, "To say we are excited to be here today is an understatement. After six years of construction and many more years of planning, we are proud to open the first new U.S. hub airport in the 21st Century," Wyatt added.

Hangar Inspections September 22-23

T-hangar and shade hangars at Salt Lake International and South Valley Regional airports will be inspected on September 22 and 23. Inspections are performed to ensure compliance with airport lease standards. Common issues include:

- Propane bottles in the hangar
- Lack of drip pans
- Un-airworthy aircraft in hangar

- Containers containing fuel in hangar
 - Non-airport issued lock securing hangar door
 - Expired fire extinguisher in hangar

The 100LL self-service fuel pedestal remains inoperative. The Airport is working to get the system up and running, but there is no known date of completion. There is a NOTAM in place notifying the system is out of service. More details to follow in October.
